

Life School - Life High School Waxahachie LifeLeader Partnership Agreement

Each school receiving funds under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) must develop a written school-parent compact jointly with parents for all students participating in Title I activities, services, and programs. That compact is part of the school's written parental involvement policy developed by the school and parents. The compact must outline how parents, the school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help students achieve the State's high standards. School Responsibilities

Life High School Waxahachie will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating student to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:
 - Instructional Framework developed in consultation with District Curriculum Departments
 - PLC and staff development conducted by our Life High School Waxahachie Department Chairs and Instructional Leaders
 - Annual staff-development tailored to the needs of our district/campus
 - Students taught by highly qualified teachers/certified teachers
 - Tutoring and enhancement provided daily

We inform families about State standards and our curriculum and assessments, suggest ideas to help parents monitor and support their student's achievement, and educate on the value of parent involvement by:

- Parent Nights (4-6 times a year)
- Parent Portal
- Link to Texas State Standards on School Website
- Weekly Parent Newsletter
- State Required STAAR Assessment Parent Notification (spring semester)
- Translator Available Upon Request
- Updates through School Messenger

Parents can make suggestions and participate in decision making at Life High School Waxahachie via:

- Parent Conferences
- Parent Survey
- Participate on Partners for Life Leadership Committee
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in secondary schools) as it relates to the individual student's achievement. Specifically, these conferences will be held:
 - Individual Conferences with Guidance Counselor, Teacher, or Administration Upon Request
 - Annual ARD, 504, ESL meetings (if the student receives special services)
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their student's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - Progress reports sent home every 3rd week of the 9 week period
 - Report cards sent home every 9 weeks
 - Online access to grades and attendance through Parent Portal
 - Annual Confidential Student Reports on State Testing
 - Annual Title I meeting (August)
 - This year's Title I meeting is being held on <u>August 12, 2024</u>. At this meeting, families will be informed of the school's Title I program and budget, the school's academic progress, upcoming state testing, and the right of parents/guardians to be involved in their child's education.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff, opportunities to volunteer, participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - Parent Conferences-upon request or half day offered twice a year
 - Join Partners for Life Parent Organization by signing up through Galaxy Digital
