

Life School Cedar Hill Parental Involvement Policy

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, each school that receives Title I, Part A funds must develop jointly with, agree on with, and distribute to, parents of participating children a written parental involvement policy that contains information required by section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) (parental involvement policy).

Part I. General Expectations

Life School Cedar Hill agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- (D) The carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1118 of the ESEA.

Part II. Description of how schools will implement required school parental involvement policy components

- 1. Life School Cedar Hill will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:

 - A meeting will be scheduled for parent input and comment on the draft policy.
- 2. Life School Cedar Hill will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the schools' participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of meetings so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. - 3. Life School Cedar Hill will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions.
- 4. Life School Cedar Hill will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts, and reading.
- 5. Life School Cedar Hill will provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002).
- 6. Life School Cedar Hill will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph-
 - The state's academic content standards
 - The state's student academic achievement standards
 - The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments
 - The requirements of Part A
 - How to monitor their child's progress, and
 - How to work with educators

- 7. Life School Cedar Hill will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement by:
 - Parenting Nights
 - Thursday Exchange newsletter
 - Classroom newsletters
 - Parent-Teacher Conferences
- 8. Life School Cedar Hill will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alterative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language parents can understand:
 - Thursday Exchange newsletter
 - Classroom newsletters
 - School website, www.lifeschools.net
 - Messaging system reminders
