



Life School Lancaster Parental Involvement Policy 2020-2021

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, each school that receives Title I, Part A funds must develop jointly with, agree on with, and distribute to, parents of participating children a written parental involvement policy that contains information required by section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) (parental involvement policy).

Part I. General Expectations

Life School Lancaster agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

Part II. Description of how schools will implement required school parental involvement policy components

1. Life School Lancaster will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:
 - The parental involvement draft policy will be reviewed by parents in a meeting with the principal.
 - Parents will be encouraged to provide input and comments on the draft policy at the meeting.

2. Life School Lancaster will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of meetings so that as many parents as possible are able to attend.  - Date/Time posted in a newsletter on the campus Remind 101 and on the campus Facebook page.

3. Life School Lancaster will, at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions.

4. Life School Lancaster will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the state assessment in at least math, language arts, and reading.

5. Life School Lancaster will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph-
 - The state's academic content standards
 - The state's student academic achievement standards
 - The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments
 - How to monitor their child's progress, and
 - How to work with educators


